## 2021 IMPERIAL TOKAIDO ROAD DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

**Day 1: Sun, Nov 07** – HONOLULU. Enjoy a preflight Oasis in the SAKURA LOUNGE reserved for Premium Economy and Business Class customers. Enjoy a cold drink and a light snack before boarding your flight to Japan. Prepare to be dazzled with the award-winning in-flight service of Japan Airlines. Depart via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 12:10 pm.

**Day 2: Mon, Nov 08** – TOKYO. Arrive Haneda International Airport at 4:25 pm. After entry formalities, transfer by full size coach to your luxurious hotel in the heart of Tokyo. Take a stroll to the Yurakucho restaurant alley, steps away from your hotel. Perhaps sushi at the famous 24-hour, Sushi Zanmai (quality sushi at reasonable prices)? So many choices – from yakitori to ramen! IMPERIAL HOTEL TOKYO (4 Nights)


**Day 3: Tue, Nov 09** – TOKYO. Enjoy your buffet breakfast at THE IMPERIAL VIKING SAL while taking in the spectacular views from the 17<sup>th</sup> floor. Start your day with a fun-filled hands-on activity. **Make your own “Furin,”** Japanese wind chime. Start by blowing glass into a round and finish by hand painting your personal treasure. Next, enjoy a **cruise along the scenic Sumida River.** Lunch is a special mini Kaiseki at **Happoen Gardens.** Happoen’s garden skillfully incorporates the basic principles of traditional garden landscaping to reproduce a natural setting. It includes several features of historic importance, such as a display of bonsai trees over 500 years old, and the “Muan” and “Kakuhoan” teahouses, transported and rebuilt on site, all harmoniously blending to create an oasis of beauty that brings pleasure throughout the year. Experience a **Traditional Tea Ceremony.** Our final stop today is the **Digital Art Aquarium,** an annual installment in Nihonbashi, by Hidetomo Kimura, that seamlessly blends Japanese culture and history with modern digital art. What truly separates this exhibit from other similar works is the use of a living element: over 8,000 Japanese goldfish, known as kingyo. These peculiar looking fish are a staple in Japanese culture, dating back to the Edo period when they were first collected by wealthy merchants before becoming a popular pastime for the common people as well. For dinner, you’re in for a treat! Imahan is known for its Sukiyaki set menu with top quality beef. (B, L, D)

**Day 4: Wed, Nov 10** – TOKYO – KAWAGOE – TOKYO. After breakfast, head out to Kawagoe, a historic castle town near Tokyo which retains the feel of old Japan. First stop is **The Railway Museum** which recounts the history of railway in Japan, exhibits many previously used train cars, teaches train operation using interesting simulators, and explains railway technology as it evolved over the years. The museum’s big collection of formerly used train cars includes steam and diesel locomotives, and retired shinkansen, passenger and freight cars. After a BBQ lunch, enjoy shopping at the **Kawagoe’s Shopping district** and exploring the **Kawagoe Festival Float Museum.** Return to Tokyo for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

**Day 5: Thur, Nov 11** – TOKYO. Full Day at Leisure. Your Licensed English speaking guide will offer an optional walking and shopping tour. Perfect day to relax and / or visit with family and friends in Tokyo. (B)

**Day 6: Fri, Nov 12** – TOKYO – HAKONE. Depart Tokyo for Hakone. Enroute, stop at a local fruit farm and **pick some fruit.** You’ll get to take some of your sweet harvest with you as a special treat for later. After lunch, continue to Hakone where much of the area is considered an active volcanic zone since its creation from eruption of Mount Hakone some 3,000 years ago. Then transfer to the hotel, where the remainder of the afternoon is at your leisure. The public onsens – which are divided for men and women – allow you to **enjoy the hot springs** whether indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. In addition, **each room will have its own private open-air bath** for you to enjoy. Enjoy either, or both, onsen/bath options during your stay. A special dinner has been arranged at the hotel. HAKONE KOWAKIEN TEN-YU (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

**Day 7: Sat, Nov 13** – HAKONE. Explore Hakone on a half-day sightseeing tour. Begin with **Owakudani** (Hell’s Valley), an area around a crater created during the last eruption of Mount Hakone some 3,000 years ago. Today, much of the area is an active volcanic zone where sulfurous fumes, hot springs and hot rivers can be experienced. On clear days, Mt. Fuji can be clearly seen from Owakudani. See the surrounding landscape from the **Hakone Ropeway.** Then explore **Hakone Shrine,** which stands at the foot of Mount Hakone along the shores of Lake Ashi. The shrine buildings are hidden in the dense forest, but are well advertised by its huge torii gates, one standing prominently in the lake and two others over the main street of Moto-Hakone. After lunch,



return to the hotel for an afternoon of leisure. Relax the afternoon away in the **public onsens** or **in your private in-room open-air bath.** Enjoy another special dinner at the hotel. (B, L, D)

**Day 8: Sun, Nov 14** – HAKONE – OSAKA. Transfer to the Odawara Station. Depart Odawara via **JR Express Train** to Shin-Osaka Station. Upon arrival in Osaka, transfer by coach to the hotel. The remainder of the day is at your leisure. Enjoy a Kamon Teppanyaki dinner at the hotel tonight, including Kobe beef. IMPERIAL HOTEL OSAKA (3 Nights) (B, D)

**Day 9: Mon, Nov 15** – OSAKA. Full Day at Leisure. Your Licensed English speaking guide will offer an optional walking and shopping tour. Perfect day to relax and / or visit with family and friends in Osaka. (B)

**Day 10: Tue, Nov 16** – OSAKA – KYOTO – OSAKA. First stop this morning is **Kyoto Imperial Palace,** which served as the residence of Japan’s Imperial Family until 1868, when the emperor and capital were moved from Kyoto to Tokyo. It is located in the spacious Kyoto Imperial Park, an attractive park in the center of the city. **Learn how to make** a local Kyoto treat – **Yatsushashi,** a Japanese confectionery which is made from rice flour, sugar, and cinnamon. Next visit **Sanju Sangendo,** the popular name for Rengeo-in, a temple in eastern Kyoto which is famous for its 1,001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of mercy. Last stop today is **Byodoin Temple,** a striking example of Buddhist Pure Land (Jodo) architecture. Together with its garden, the temple represents the Pure Land Paradise and was influential on later temple construction. Evening at leisure. (B, L)

**Day 11: Wed, Nov 17** – OSAKA – HONOLULU. Start the day with a visit to **Kuromon Ichiba Market,** a lively covered market which stretches for 580 meters in Osaka’s Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles and confectionery. Many stalls will prepare, cook and serve their food to you right on the spot! An excellent place to stroll, sample, and snack on a delicious variety of fresh market foods. Next, visit **Dotonbori,** one of Osaka’s most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori canal. It is a popular shopping and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. Next stop is **Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade,** Osaka’s premier shopping center. Approximately 600 meters long, this area is unique as it combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with expensive department stores and top designer fashion labels. After lunch (on your own), transfer to the Kansai International Airport for the flight home. Arrive early and spend some time at the airport stores shopping for last minute omiyage. Depart Osaka via Japan Airlines flt #792 at 10:00 pm and arrive Honolulu at 10:20 am the same day. Aloha and Welcome Home! (B)
